SCIENTIFIC LIFE

THE WORKS OF THE SECTION OF PHILOSOPHY, THEOLOGY AND PSYCHOLOGY from the AOSR Spring Conference *Digitization in Science* - May 2023

At the Philosophy, Theology and Psychology section of the AOSR Spring Conference, held on May 19-20, 2023 under the Digitalization in Science genre, 13 papers were submitted. The work of the respective section took place at the AOSR Headquarters on May 19, with the physical presence of the communicants or online. Moderators were Univ. Prof. Dr. Aurel Papari – President of the Philosophy, Psychology, Theology Section and Univ. Prof. Dr. Mihai Bădescu – Vice President of the Philosophy, Psychology, Theology Section.

The work of the session was opened by Acad. Constantin Bălăceanu-Stolnici with an online communication, which included *General considerations about digitization in the sciences*. Next, the following communications were presented, in order, supported by the members of the section present at the AOSR headquarters, namely: Univ. Prof. Dr. Ioan N. Roşca (Honour Member of The Academy of the Romanian Scientists): *The Impact of Digitalization in Education and Research*; Univ. Prof. Dr. Andra Seceleanu (Corresponding Member of the Academy of the Romanian Scientists): *An analysis of the evolution of Russian Propaganda Narratives in Romania*; Univ. Prof. Dr. Aurel Papari (Full Member of The Academy of the Romanian Scientists): *Media – risk factor in suicide*; Univ. Prof. Dr. Mihai Bădescu (Full Member of The Academy of the Romanian Scientists): *Towards a New Digital European Constitutionalism*?; Prof. Dr. Viorica Ungureanu, (Corresponding Member of the Academy of Romanian Scientists): *The Impact of Digital Transformation in Sciences on Human Beings*.

Other members of the Section of Philosophy, Psychology, Theology with communications registered in the program, without the physical presence of the communicants were: Univ. Assoc. PhD Henrieta Serban (Corresponding Member of the Academy of Romanian Scientists): *The Naturalization of the Artificial. People lie, IA hallucinate*; Univ. Assoc. Dr. Nela Mircică: *Online communication and scientific research*; Univ. Prof. Dr. Ana Rodica Stăiculescu (in collaboration with Bianca Ioana Garabet): *The impact of academic stress on the adaptive capacity of psychology students*; Univ. Prof. Dr. Ana Rodica Stăiculescu (in collaboration with Dr. Gheorghe Nadoleanu and Dr. Emanuela Bran): *The Rise of Dataism in Science: A Sociological and Philosophical Analysis*.

At the Scientific Session of the section, three communications by authors who are not members of AOSR were also registered: Collective formed by 1) Univ. Prof. Dr. Eng. Titi Paraschiv - Titu Maiorescu University in Bucharest, 2) Univ. Prof. Dr. Eng. Felix Constantin Adochiei, Polytechnic University of Bucharest 3) Lecturer Dr. Ruxandra Victoria Paraschiv - Titu Maiorescu University in Bucharest 4) Lecturer Dr. Eng. Ioana Adochiei – Military Technical Academy 5) Eng. Ștefana Duță, master's student at the Polytechnic University of Bucharest: *Study on the relationship between stress and EEG wave types*; Maria SINACI, "Aurel Vlaicu" University of Arad: *Digital Technology and Ethical Challenges in the Humanities*; Dr. Elena Lazăr, Romanian Academy: *The role of science and communication in digitization*.

All the communications presented aroused great interest and provided an opportunity for an exchange of ideas between the communicants. In the initial communication (Acad. Constantin Bălăceanu-Stolnici) emphasis was placed on the positive impact of digitization for the progress of scientific knowledge. The following three communications are relevant both to the opportunities of digitization in the sciences, as well as some negative influences on research and education, such as the possibility of plagiarism and the lack of formative virtues of face-to-face communication, especially in education (the communication presented by Univ. Prof. Dr. Ioan N. Rosca), or the possibility of manipulation through online communication (the communication supported by Univ. Prof. Dr. Andra Seceleanu), or the negative, suicidal impact of negative communication through the mass media on young people (Univ. Prof. Dr. Aurel Papari). A separate communication drew attention to the fact that the digitization process requires a new European constitutionalism (University Prof. Dr. Mihai Bădescu). Another special communication referred to the excess of digital communication on the human being, through detachment from nature and artificialization. (Prof. Dr. Viorica Ungureanu). We appreciate that, as a whole, the papers presented have contributed to deepening the impact of digitization in the sciences from the perspective of applied philosophy (sociological and legal) and individual and social psychology.
