

ABOUT THE NECESSITY OF NEW MANAGEMENT MODELS OF NATIONAL SECURITY

Abstract: *The evaluation of the security environment at the beginning of the 21st century, as well as the more and more complicated interactions between the international stage actors, found in a process of re-finding a new balanced state, is revealing the fact that national security management is becoming a more and more complex process, with a structure formed of very divergent components, but which are yet perfectly interconnected.
