Ioan N. Roşca – university professor PhD at the University of Bucharest (1968-2001) and Spiru Haret University (2001-2011) in the field of philosophy and cultural journalism. Through published works, he asserted himself in three fields of culture: philosophy, cultural journalism, literary creation (poetry and prose) and literary criticism. He has published, as the sole author, 18 books on philosophy (on the history of philosophy, philosophical anthropology, axiology, philosophy of history, as well as a book expounding a personal philosophical system), 3 books on cultural journalism and 6 books in the field of poetry, prose, literary critics and art critics.

He was awarded the "Vasile Conta" prize by the Romanian Academy for the work *The Specifics of French Phenomenology: Maurice Merleau-Ponty* (2021) and the "Constantin Noica" prize by the Romanian Academy of Scientists for the book *Landmarks of Romanian Philosophy. From Dimitrie Cantemir to Constantin Noica* (2017) and the "Anton Bacalbaşa" award for the work *Philosophy of Integrativity* (2021).

His book of personal philosophical synthesis *The Philosophy of Integrativity* was also translated into Italian: *La filosofia dell'integrabilità*, Istituto Teseo Alta

Formazione e Ricerca, 2022; Prefazione di Alessandro Denti: Il sistema philosophico di Ioan Roșca, o del gioco tra-duttivo dell'Essere e dell'Esistente).

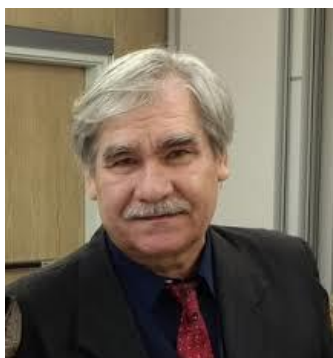
GHINEA Vlad Mihail

Eminescu”; priest of “Sts. Apostles Peter and Paul” Romanian Orthodox Church in New York; director of *Lumina Lina. Gracious Light*, a review of Romanian spirituality and culture, and of the journals *Symposium* and *Romanian Medievalia*; President of the American branch of the Academy of Romanian Scientists; writer, member of the Writers’ Union of Romania; journalist, member of the Union of Professional Journalists, Romania; member of the editorial board of over 20 literary and academic magazines and journals in Romania and the USA; member in numerous national (Romanian and USA) and international associations.

Theodor Damian has published over 40 books in the fields of theology, philosophy, literary criticism and poetry.

Among the many prizes, medals and distinctions he received over the years, in 2023 he was honored with The Order *Sf. INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS SUBMITTING THE ELECTRONIC FORM OF THE MANUSCRIPT

The **ANNALS OF THE ACADEMY OF ROMANIAN SCIENTISTS**, series on **PHILOSOPHY, PSYCHOLOGY AND THEOLOGY** covers the following fields:

- ♦ MIND PHILOSOPHY
- ♦ SCIENCE AND RELIGION
- ♦ COGNITIVE SCIENCES
- ♦ GENERAL AND APPLIED PSYCHOLOGY

- ♦ THEOLOGY, HISTORY OF RELIGION

Papers presenting theoretical and/or experimental contribution concerning up-to-date research are strongly encouraged. Book reviews are also accepted.

The preferred languages for papers are **English** (both **UK** and **US** spelling are permitted, provided that the spelling is consistent within the paper) and **French** (France).

All submitted manuscripts should be as concise as possible and should include an **even** number of pages (about **12 pages**). The software used to produce your document should be **Word for Windows**.

The format of the document is A4 (21 cm x 29.7 cm). The settings for the mirror of the page are: Top **4.7 cm**; Bottom **4.7 cm**; Left **3.5 cm**; Right **3.5 cm**. Please use **Times New Roman** font, size **12** for the main text and size **10** for the figures and tables.

The text will include the following sequence of parts:

- **Title**
- **Name(s) of author(s)** and author's **affiliation**
- **Abstract** (*not* more than 100 words) in **Romanian** and in **English**
- The **main text** (authors must arrange the subject matter under headings: **Introduction, Experimental details, Results, Conclusions ...**, in **bold**).
- **References** should be listed at the article's end (for facilitate ISI statistics), and numbered in the **order of their appearance** in the text. Use numerals in square brackets to cite references. Footnotes including bibliographic material are also admitted.
- All **line drawings** and **photos** should be in **grey scale**.
- **Equations, tables, illustrations** will be positioned **within** the paragraphs.

The whole responsibility for the accuracy of the scientific interpretations and experimental data, as well as for the accuracy of the English text belongs entirely to the author(s). Submission of the manuscript implies that it is **not** under consideration for publication elsewhere.

All communications must indicate the **name, phone number** and **e-mail address** of the author to whom proofs should be sent. This author is responsible for informing **all** co-authors that the manuscript has been submitted for this series.
